Students must complete 24 semester units drawn from three different departments (diciplines).

**Approved Diciplines include:** Anthropology, Art, Communication, Economics, English, Geography, History, Latin American Studies, Political Science, Public Administration, Sociology, Spanish, Television-Film and New Media, and Women's Studies.
